Call for Entries Awards Program, New York Construction's Best of 05

Submission Deadline: September 2, 2005

New York Construction presents its annual awards program dedicated to honoring the best projects and the companies that design and build them in New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut.

An independent jury of construction, design, and real estate industry leaders will evaluate projects in 24 categories. We will profile each winning project in the December 2005 issue of *New York Construction* and honor the teams on those projects at our December awards ceremony.

Criteria

1. Projects must be built in New York, New Jersey, or Connecticut. 2. Submitted projects (not just your firm's work) must be complete within the calendar year 2005 to be eligible. 3. Size is not one of the criteria - submit the smallest, innovative renovation project or multi-million dollar developments alike. 4. There is no limit to the number of submissions per entrant and no entry fee. 5. Send all of your best projects in any category.

Submission Requirements

1. Obtain an entry form online from [newyork.construction.com/Best of 2004](http://newyork.construction.com/Best%20of%202004) (download and print) or request a faxed copy by calling 212-904-3890.
2. Submission must include:
 - Entry form
 - No less than three representative copyright-released photographs available in high-resolution print or digital images (300 dpi at 4" X 6" or larger)
 - Responses to entry form questions in electronic file on CD and hard copy
 - List of primary team members with contact information in electronic file on CD and hard copy

To Win

A jury of industry leaders from the construction, design, and real estate industries will judge the Best of 2005 Awards. The members will review each submission to determine:

- What did the project team set out to achieve?
- How did the team collaborate to achieve those goals?
- What were the specific challenges faced on the job?
- How well did the team overcome those challenges?
- What innovations or unique aspects set the project apart?

The jury has discretion to select the winning projects with emphasis on those that best achieve the goals established by the team and that overcome challenges on the job and exhibit extraordinary teamwork.

Award Categories
